### **About 'NIGHT, MOTHER**

Winner of the 1983 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, *'NIGHT, MOTHER* is a story about a mother and her daughter, about isolation and despair. The play opens on just another Saturday night in the home of Jessie and Thelma. But this all changes when Jessie asks the question, "Where's Daddy's gun?" Faced with the perception that her life no longer has significant meaning, Jessie has decided to kill herself, and she makes her intentions clear to Thelma. Will she or won't she end her life? And why? Suspense builds as the mother desperately tries to alter her daughter's plans.

### **About Marsha Norman**

Growing up in Louisville, Kentucky, Marsha Norman was introduced to the world of theatre when she went to see children's plays at the Actors Theatre of Louisville. Norman began to work as a journalist for the *Louisville Times* after graduating from college, but after the success of her first play, *Getting Out* (1977), she moved to New York. For *'NIGHT, MOTHER*, Marsha Norman won the 1983 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, the Blackburn Prize, and the Hull-Warriner and Drama Desk Awards. Ms. Norman is the Vice President of the Dramatists Guild, and currently, with Christopher Durang, Co-Chair of the Playwriting Department of The Julliard School.
